Readings from Scripture

Gospel Reading – Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus's birth—which happened in Bethlehem of (Palestine), during the reign of Herod—astrologers from the east came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the newborn ruler of the Jews? We observed his star in the east and have come to honor him." At this news Herod became greatly worried, as did all of Jerusalem. He gathered all the chief priests and religious scholars of the people, and he asked them where the Messiah was to be born.

They told him, "In Bethlehem of (Palestine); for this is what the prophet wrote: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the leaders of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel."'

Herod called the astrologers aside and found out from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and get detailed information about the child; and when you have found him, report back to me word so that I may also go and honor him."

After they heard Herod, the astrologers set out. The star that they had observed in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were filled with joy. Upon entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and honored him. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Because they had been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another route.
