Gospel Reading – Matthew 6:26-34 (*The Message* translation)

Look at the birds, free and unfettered, not tied down to a job description, careless in the care of God. And you count far more to God than birds. Has anyone by fussing in front of the mirror ever gotten taller by so much as an inch? All this time and money wasted on fashion-do you think it makes that much difference? Instead of looking at the fashions, walk out into the fields and look at the wildflowers. They never primp or shop, but have you ever seen color and design quite like it? The ten best-dressed people in the country look shabby alongside them. If God gives such attention to the appearance of wildflowers-most of which are never even seen-don't you think God will attend to you, take pride in you, do the best by you? What I'm trying to do here is to get you to relax, to not be so preoccupied with getting, so you can respond to God's giving. People who don't know God and God's way, fuss over these things, but you know both God and how God works. Steep your life in Godreality, God-initiative, God-provisions. Don't worry about missing out. You'll find all your everyday human concerns will be met. Give your entire attention to what God is doing right now, and don't get worked up about what may or may not happen tomorrow. God will help you deal with whatever hard things come up when the time comes.

A Note on the Prelude: Olivier Messiaen's *Meditations on the Mysteries of the Holy Trinity* is a massive work of nine movements, lasting approximately one hour. Composed in 1969, the work represents Messiaen's mature musical language in which almost every note and rhythm serves as a symbol ranging from liturgical, biblical, and theological texts to meticulously notated birdsong. "Meditation 2" focuses on the Holiness of God, symbolized by a Gregorian Chant Alleluia followed by a chorus of celebratory birdsongs.

The work unfolds as follows: God is Holy (Gregorian Chant); an excerpt from the Gloria (dissonant, sometimes extremely dissonant chords that always find a peaceful resolution) and birdsong (wren, blackbird, chaffinch, garden warbler in an extended solo, and blackcap warbler). The movement concludes with a return of the Gregorian Alleluia, followed by the off-key song of the yellowhammer.

LENTEN BIRD COVER PHOTOS. Throughout Lent, our bulletin images are being provided to us by **Brooks Mathewson**. Brooks is an ecologist, educator, and photographer with a Master's in Forest Science from Harvard University. He has published over two dozen peer-reviewed papers, technical reports, and popular articles on his research on terrestrial salamander ecology, tree phenology, breeding bird biology, and bird migration. Brooks' photography has been published in magazines, newspapers, textbooks, and conservation reports and has been displayed at the National Science Foundation, Harvard Forest, Appalachian Mountain Club, National Wildlife Refuges, Massachusetts and Rhode Island Audubon Society Sanctuaries, libraries, and in personal collections. Brooks has designed and led numerous citizen science research projects focusing on urban ecology and has taught natural history, ecology, and photography to elementary, middle school, high school, college, and continuing education students. He has appeared on radio and television programs and has given over one hundred lectures to the general public.

GBIO IN-DISTRICT MEETING CHANGE OF DATE & LOCATION. On **Wednesday, February 21, at 7:00 pm,** the Greater Boston Interfaith Organization is organizing an In-District Meeting with Representatives Livingston and Michlewitz at Old South Church, 645 Boylston Street.
