





Hebrew Bible Reading – Isaiah 60:1-5, 7b-8, 11, 13, 17-20 Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of GOD has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth and thick darkness the peoples, but the Holy One will arise upon you, and God's glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light and rulers to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together; they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried in their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you; the wealth of the nations shall come to you... and I will glorify my glorious house. Who are these that fly like a cloud and like doves to their windows? Your gates shall always be open; day and night they shall not be shut... The glory of Lebanon shall come to you, the cypress, the plane, and the pine,

to beautify the place of my sanctuary, and I will glorify where my feet rest. I will appoint Peace as your overseer and Righteousness as your taskmaster. Violence shall no more be heard in your land, devastation or destruction within your borders; you shall call your walls Salvation and your gates Praise. The sun shall no longer be your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon give light to you by night, but the HOLY ONE will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory. Your sun shall no more go down or your moon withdraw itself, for God will be your everlasting light, and your days of mourning shall be ended.



Unison Reading of the Psalm – From Psalm 146 Hallelujah! Praise God, O my soul! Put not your trust in rulers, nor in any child of earth, for there is no help in them. When they breathe their last, they return to earth, and in that day their thoughts perish. Happy are they who have the God of Jacob, Rachel, and Leah for their help, whose hope is in the Holy One their God; Who made heaven and earth, the seas, and all that is in them who keeps God's promise forever; Who gives justice to those who are oppressed, and food to those who hunger. New Testament Reading – Ephesians 5:6-14

Walk as children of light, for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. Try to find out what is pleasing to God. For it is shameful even to mention what such people do secretly, but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light. Therefore it says, "Sleeper, awake! Rise from the dead, and Christ will shine on you."

Gospel Reading – Matthew 5:14-16

People do not light a lamp and put it under the bushel basket; rather, they put it on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. 


