Scripture Readings:

Responsive Reading of Psalm 19:1-4 (*The Message translation*)

One: God's glory is on tour in the skies, God-craft on exhibit across the horizon. Madame Day holds classes every morning, Professor Night lectures each evening.

Many: **Their words aren't heard, Their voices aren't recorded, But their silence fills the earth: unspoken truth is spoken everywhere.**

One: God makes a huge dome for the sun—a superdome! The morning sun's a new spouse leaping from the honeymoon bed, the daybreaking sun an athlete racing to the tape.

Many: **That's how God's Word vaults across the skies from sunrise to sunset, melting ice, scorching deserts, warming hearts to faith.**

New Testament Reading: James 3:1-12

Not many of you should become teachers, my siblings, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. For every species of animal and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless God, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My siblings, this ought not to be so. Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? Can a fig tree, my siblings, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

Gospel Reading: Mark 8:27-38

Jesus went on with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi; and on the way he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that I am?” And they answered him, “John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.” He asked them, “But who do you say that I am?” Peter answered him, “You are the Messiah.” And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

Then he began to teach them that the Promised One must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, “Get behind me, you Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.”

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, “If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life?

Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Whoever in this faithless and corrupt generation is ashamed of me and my words will find, in turn, that the Promised One and the holy angels will be ashamed of that person, when all come before our God in glory.”

REGISTER FOR IN PERSON OPTION FOR WORSHIP!! For the first time in over 500 days, we offering in-person options for worship on Sunday, September 12, 2021. Thanks be to God! [Click here to register.](#) In order to do this in a safe and compassionate way, keeping the most vulnerable in our community protected, and risks low, we will require pre-registration and proof of COVID vaccination. In order to maintain physical distancing, services will be available for the first 25 people who pre-register (look for registration to come out over [church e-listserv](#) each week). Each person who attends in person will be required to show a copy (photocopy or photo from your phone/ camera) of their vaccination card as per Council's decision. Masks will be required for the entire service. Singing hymns with masks on will be allowed. And those who do not come in person will be able to fully worship online via Zoom & YouTube live as per usual.

OUTDOOR JUBILEE WORSHIP SUNDAY 9/19 10:30am: Next week, our Climate Jubilee Team will invite us to take part in an outdoor service that will be part pilgrimage, part processional, part prayer walk, part rally, part protest march, part blessing as we walk from the corner of the Public Garden over the newly opened Arthur Fielder bridge to the Esplanade. We will begin at 10:30am at the George Robert White Memorial Angel ("Cast Thy Bread Upon the Waters") near the corner of Arlington & Beacon, and finish near the Hatch Shell on the Esplanade. NEW! BOSTON VOTES SEPT 14! If you are a Boston Voter and will vote at your polling place on September 14th, you have the chance to help rectify a significant inequity! Some precincts in Boston have thousands of registered voters and some have just a few hundred. Precincts serving people of color tend to be the more crowded, which means longer wait times and more inconvenience for people of color who want to vote. When you arrive at your polling place on primary day, September 14th, you can help by recording how long it takes you to vote. A Northeastern University research team working with GBIO will gather the data and make the case for changing the precinct boundaries. All you need to do is use your smartphone to log in to www.Time2VoteBoston.org when you arrive at your polling place. On the website, simply enter your phone number and then start the timer. Turn it off when you have finished voting. Those who participate will have a chance to win a \$50 gift card. For more information contact Faith Perry at flejpw@aol.com.
